# MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO

Recent data from the Department of Public Health showed that accidental drug overdoses are the leading cause of unintentional deaths in Connecticut with Black and Hispanic Communities experiencing the most dramatic increases in accidental overdose deaths. The effects of the Pandemic have impacted the rate of overdose deaths but that isn't the only factor. Fentanyl is a leading contributor and was found in 86% of all opioid related deaths in 2021. There is also concern around the increase in Xylazine, a horse tranquilizer, being

detected in overdose deaths. In 2018 there were no deaths involving Xylazine, but by 2021 over 300 people had Xylazine in their system at the time of a fatal overdose. With you support we will continue to provide education, prevention, and harm reduction resources to our community.

I am also proud to share that the quality of our work continues to be recognized as we received a 3-year reaccreditation from the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF)!


